Strengthening Grassroots Advocacy Across Africa

The ACHA Advocacy ECHO is an eight-month, Pan-African virtual training and capacity-building initiative designed to equip Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) from Anglophone, Francophone, and Lusophone Africa with the tools to meaningfully contribute to national and regional cervical cancer elimination efforts.

Many grassroots CSOs, often led by survivors and caregivers, are deeply committed to ending cervical cancer but face challenges such as limited policy engagement training, unclear advocacy frameworks, sporadic resource mobilization, and inconsistent communication. The Advocacy ECHO bridges these gaps.

Grounded in the Project ECHO model, this platform offers expert-led sessions, mentorship, and peer learning to build the confidence, competence, and coordination of CSOs. Participants gain practical skills in policy engagement, coalition building, resource mobilization, media advocacy, and community-led monitoring, ensuring advocacy efforts are strategic, data-driven, and impactful.

By fostering grassroots leadership and strengthening advocacy capacity, ACHA Advocacy ECHO ensures CSOs are no longer on the sidelines but at the center of national and regional cervical cancer conversations.


